Mental Health and the Workplace

Workplaces have a direct influence on the physical, mental, economic and social well-being of workers. In turn, the health of their families and communities at large are affected. Work is a meaningful part of most people's adult life, and has value far beyond a regular paycheck. Work substantially contributes to a person's identity; it provides income for an individual and his or her family, and can make a person feel that he or she is playing a useful role in society.

There is increasing evidence that both the content and context of work can play a role in the development of mental health problems in the workplace. Mental health problems, such as depression, anxiety and stress are common, and directly impact workplaces through increased absenteeism, reduced productivity, and increased costs.

According to a study done by the Centre for Addiction and Mental Health (CAMH), mental illness causes more lost work days in Canada than any other condition, costing the economy \$51 billion a year in lost productivity. The study also found that mental health leave on average costs double that of leave for a physical illness. Clearly, there is still a great need to reduce stigma, promote early intervention and provide a healthy environment by putting better supports and strategies in place for employees suffering from a mental illness. Employers have a responsibility to not only provide a psychologically healthy workplace, but also promote positive mental health in the workplace.

Dr. Ash Bender, a well known clinician in the Work, Stress and Health Program at CAMH and keynote speaker at the upcoming CAMH in the Community event. "There is not only a need for awareness of mental health issues and their impact on work, but a need for action. Awareness and action will undoubtedly benefit employees, employers and society at large," said Dr. Bender. These issues, along with strategies for action will be discussed on February 24th, 2011 at a free **CAMH in the Community event: Mental Health Promotion and the Workplace** from 1:00 pm - 4:30 pm in Burlington, ON.

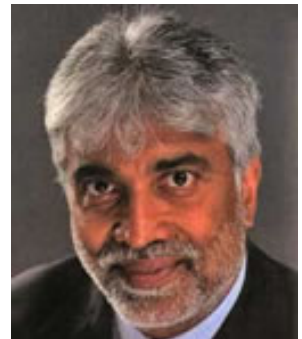
Dr. Ash Bender, MD, FRCPC
