

Advanced CBT Course: *Supervised Applications*

*Eight evening sessions
Starting on September 10, 2007*

The Advanced CBT Course: Supervised Applications is a practical, hands-on program designed to provide in-depth skills training in cognitive therapy through a combination of lectures, video demonstrations, skills modeling, role-playing practice and – in particular – the longitudinal supervision of cases drawn from the trainees' own practice. Each session consists of a didactic presentation followed by case supervision. Enrolment is strictly limited to 12 participants. Participants will audiotape their patient sessions and use these tapes for supervision. Please include a detailed description of your CBT training with your registration form. The reading requirement for the course is: **Cognitive Therapy for Challenging Problems, 2005** by JS Beck.

FACULTY

Greg Dubord, M.D. is the Director of the Toronto Centre for Cognitive Therapy and Lecturer in the Department of Psychiatry at the University of Toronto. He trained under the founder of cognitive therapy, Dr. Aaron T. Beck, and was the first Canadian to be certified by the Beck Institute. Dr. Dubord is the Founding Director of the Intermediate and Advanced Cognitive Therapy Courses at the Centre for Addiction and Mental Health, Co-Director of the U of T CBT Certificate Program, and a Founding Fellow of the Academy of Cognitive Therapy. He facilitates CBT workshops internationally.

Neil A. Rector, Ph.D., C.Psych. is a Psychologist and the Director of the Anxiety Disorders Clinic at the Centre for Addiction and Mental Health. He is also an Associate Professor of Psychiatry at the University of Toronto. Dr. Rector is a Founding Fellow of the Academy of Cognitive Therapy and is very active in the research, teaching and practice of cognitive therapy.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND

This course is for mental health practitioners who have completed the Intermediate Cognitive Therapy Course or Institute at the Centre for Addiction and Mental Health (or equivalent).

FORMAT

Each session will feature 30 minutes of didactics, followed by breakout into two small groups for supervision of audiotaped sessions.

PARTICIPANTS WILL

- Learn to develop more accurate cognitive case formulations
- Learn to more effectively apply behavioural and cognitive restructuring techniques
- Learn to make better use of the interpersonal process in therapy
