The Addictions Program at the Centre for Addiction and Mental Health (CAMH) is a centre of excellence in clinical treatment, research, education and training in addiction medicine. Services provide a continuum of care that spans both the Russell Street (outpatient) and the Queen Street (inpatient) sites. Specialised addiction training in the areas of assessment and diagnosis, treatment (medication management including methadone maintenance, counselling, withdrawal management, smoking cessation) and concurrent disorders is available. The following learning opportunities are available through our program:

1. Third and fourth year medical student rotations.

3. Addiction Medicine Enhanced Skills Fellowship

This one-year clinical fellowship position is an opportunity for physicians to develop clinical skills in dealing with alcohol and drug problems. The fellow has the option of participating in the Academic Fellowship Program in the Department of Family and Community Medicine (A), the MScCH offered through the School of Graduate Studies (B), on a part-time basis. In these cases, residents spend approximately 75% of their time doing clinical work at the CAMH. A 100% clinical fellowship is also possible. If desired, the fellow may arrange a weekly "half-day back" in family medicine at one of the DFCM's teaching units.

(A) Family Medicine Academic Fellowship: This is a twelve-month full-time fellowship (may also be taken part-time), co-sponsored by the Centre for Addiction and Mental Health and the Department of Family and Community Medicine at the University of Toronto. The program commences July 1st of each year. The purpose of the fellowship is to provide training in academic family medicine, including alcohol and drug problems. The emphasis is on developing teaching and research skills for faculty in university departments of family medicine.

(B) MScCH Programme: Co-sponsored by the Department of Family and Community Medicine and the Dalla Lana School of Public Health. The purpose of the fellowship is to provide training in academic family medicine at the Masters Level.

APPLICATION INFORMATION

Prerequisites: Prerequisites for the clinical fellowship position include completion of a residency, ability to work clinically in English and independent or educational license to practice in Ontario (conditional acceptance for those writing certification exams this year).

Remuneration: Payment of Clinical Fellows and third-year residents is \$60, 000 per annum.

Fellowship applications: A curriculum vitae, personal statement, TOEFL scores (if English is not the applicant's first language), letter of recommendation from the Programme Director where the applicant completed the residency and two letters of reference are required. Selection is based on qualifications of applicants and a short interview. Please see the DFCM website for more information:
